MEETING QUESTIONS During the meeting, your input will be requested on the following questions, which have been developed by the State to gather information on the effective operation and performance of special education programs throughout the State. **Input will focus exclusively on these questions:**

1. **Topic: Student Support Services.** An effective school program has supports in place to meet the needs of all students. What are the options available in Elgin ISD to support the needs of struggling students?
2. **Topic: Parent Participation.** One purpose of the IDEA is to strengthen the role of parents and ensure family participation in the education of their children. Within the context of Elgin ISD, how are parents involved in the educational process for their children?
3. **Topic: Student Participation.** A goal of the IDEA is to have high expectations for students with disabilities and include them in the same opportunities available to all students in the Elgin ISD. Describe how students with disabilities participate and achieve in the school setting in the same ways as students without disabilities.
4. **Topic: Graduation and Transition Planning.** The goal of education is to prepare students to live productive, independent adult lives. In what ways does Elgin ISD ensure that students with disabilities are prepared to live as productive adults after leaving school?

Written input in response to these questions will not be accepted.
