

## Are you or your family in transition?

- Enrollment
- Immunizations
- Transportation
- Pre-K
- College financial aid
- Clothing
- School supplies
- Community referrals

## Who are Homeless Children and Youth?

The McKinney-Vento Act (Section 725) defines "homeless children and youth" as:

Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, including children youth who are:

1. Share the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason.
2. Live in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations.
3. Live in emergency or transitional shelters.
4. Abandoned in hospitals.
5. Await foster care placement.
6. Children and youth who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, regular sleeping accommodations.
7. Children and youth who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.
8. The term "unaccompanied youth" includes a youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian. This would include runaways living in runaway shelters, abandoned buildings, cars, on the streets, or in other inadequate housing; children and youth denied housing by their families.
